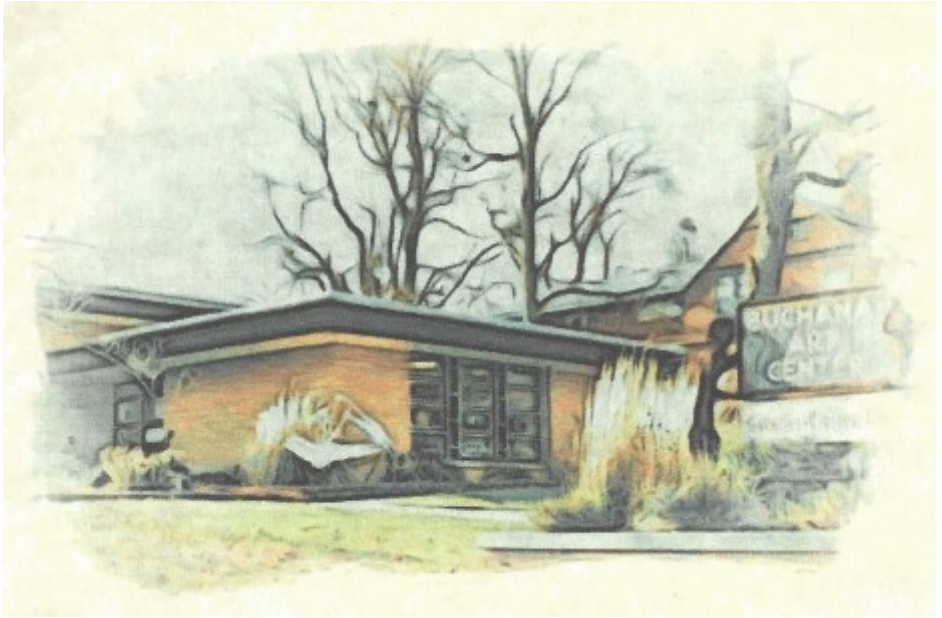

June 14-Flower Power—Registration Required by June 9

First we'll learn about the parts of a flower, then we'll make HUGE flower sculptures. We'll also plant a flower pot to take home. This class is not just for girls! Boys like flowers too you know.

June 21-Summer Solstice—Registration Required by June 16

We'll learn about how the Solstice is celebrated around the world. Then we'll make sundials and festive hats to celebrate the LONGEST day of the year... and lemonade to cool us off.

June 28-Eat Your Fruit—Registration Required by June 23

We'll make large scale drawings, prints or paintings of summer fruit. We'll also make a fun fruit salad snack to share for lunch. We need to know about any fruit or food allergies.

July 12-Light and Shadow Paintings—Registration Required by July 7

If it's sunny, we'll look for shadows to trace onto large paper, then we'll create mixed media paintings by tracing the shadows cast by summer light. No worries if it rains, we'll make our own shadows inside.

July 19-Save the Pollinators—Registration Required by July 14

We'll learn about who those pollinators are and where they like to live. Then we'll build mini pollinator houses to provide a habitat for our home gardens.

July 26, Big Beautiful Butterflies—Registration Required by July 21

We'll learn about what kinds of plants attract butterflies, plant our own mini butterfly garden and create Big, Beautiful, Symmetrical 3-D Butterflies.

August 2-Big Bad Bugs...The Sequel—Registration Required by July 28

If you're old or young enough to remember Big Bad Bugs you'll love this class. If you've never heard of Big Bad Bugs, you're in for a treat. We'll spend the day making the Biggest, Baddest, Scariest BUGS you've ever seen.

August 9-Site Specific Earth Art—Registration Required by August 4

We'll explore and collect on the grounds of the Buchanan Art Center, then we'll weave, collage, and assemble unique pieces of ephemeral art.

August 23-Fish Prints and Kites—Registration Required by August 18

We'll learn about the Japanese art of Koinobori ("carp streamers"), and Gyotaku Fish Prints. Then we'll make prints and make our own kites, and a variety of embellishments to make our own painted fish kites.

August 30-Paper Palooza—Registration Required by August 25

We'll make our own colored paper pulp that we'll use to "paint" a scene inspired by summer. We'll also learn to make simple pop-ups cards and origami, bugs and flowers.

For centuries people around the world have made paper. From the Egyptians, who pounded papyrus stalks into flat sheets on which to write and paint, to today's factory produced paper, paper has provided the basis for a wide variety of arts and crafts. In this three day paper making workshop, children will make their own paper from paper found in recycling bins, embellishing it with natural and repurposed objects. Additionally, the children will work with paper clay, create paper collage, build paper sculptures, and fashion paper bowls.

RAKU DRAGONS

MORNING CLAN #1 MEETS FRIDAYS 10 a.m. TO NOON

AFTERNOON CLAN #2 MEETS FRIDAYS 1 TO 3 p.m.

BOTH CLANS MEET SATURDAY 8 a.m. TO NOON FOR FIRING

On the first day students will study the history of dragons and their meaning in different cultures, then sculpt their own original versions in clay. The second day they will apply glazes to their dragons, write them a biography and prepare them for hibernation until the firing day. On the firing day they will watch their dragons go into the flames in the kiln and magically emerge minutes later in beautiful new colors and breathing smoke. Parents are required to accompany their child to supervise on the firing day and are encouraged to purchase a pre-made piece to glaze and fire themselves. The dragons will be ready in time for entry in the Berrien County Youth Fair.

They will interpret these garden forms in their own artwork. Additionally, the children will explore and create in the Buchanan Art Center's beautiful garden, and sculpt moving garden ornaments. Intermediate Digital Photography class will build on what students have learned in their previous Digital Photography classes at BAC or from their own experience: the essence of an image, composition, and use of light, as well as manual adjustments, such as aperture, shutter speed and ISO. Weather permitting, the students will practice all of these aspects on photo walks in local nature preserves as a part of the first and the third class sessions. The second day of the class will be chosen depending on the weather and the students' preferences. It can be any day between the first and the last day of the class. On that day the students will meet on the shore of Lake Michigan to take photos of the sunset. There will be no classroom session on that day.

NO COST for 8 three hour passes (total 24 hours). Clay must be purchased as needed for \$25/25#.

The clay studio will be open for extra time only to students who regularly attend class. It will be supervised by facilitators who are not there to instruct but to answer questions about studio policies and proper use of equipment and materials. Students will work independently and should responsibly observe all studio policies posted in the studio and provided to each student. Students are not to use the studio at any other time except to attend class, briefly check on or pick up work. Each registered student will receive 8 non-transferable passes that must be signed, dated and turned into the facilitator at each visit regardless of whether they stay the entire time or not. Any abuse of this privilege will result in its cancellation.

The first day of class students will be guided in how to hand build in a playful, spontaneous way that can result in whimsical free form vessels and sculptures. Since Raku glazes are not food safe and the finished product is not waterproof, form doesn't have to follow function and your imagination is your only limit. No experience is required. Glazes will be applied and dried on the second class. In the afternoon students will then help send their pieces through the fire and smoke that creates the exciting effects unique to Raku. Everything should be fired and ready to take home by approximately 3 p.m.
